Safeguard Iowa Partnership encourages businesses of all sizes to create a business continuity plan. Business continuity plans are not just for disasters. Having a plan can often ensure what you can't insure - that your organization can continue to function when the unexpected hits. Sometimes you have to think the unthinkable, expect the unexpected to succeed.

Preparation is key, so Safeguard Iowa is bringing back our business continuity **"Take 5"** scenarios to help you train your employees with two scenario options each month.

These quick scenarios are not intended to replace ongoing training but to supplement and add additional preparation for your teams all year long.

Scenario 13: Medical

It's 1:00 PM and the workday has been going pretty smoothly. During lunch break, Donnie, the CFO of your organization went for a run and has returned to your break room. The break room is full of employees and Donnie complains of chest pains, shortness of breath and collapses to the floor.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How would you react?
- 2. Have you set up coordination with emergency medical services? Have they toured your facility?
- 3. Do you have medical equipment on premise? Do you offer training for employees on how to utilize equipment?
- 4. Is your organization apart of SMART911 facilities?
- 5. Have you identified staff with medical training?

Scenario 14: Active Shooter

Employees of your organization start to receive text messages from friends that work in a neighboring building regarding an active shooter in their lobby. Employees across the street are starting to run out of the their building and into the street, some are even coming to your building.

Discussion Questions:

- 11. How would you react?
- 2. What procedures do you take?
- 3. How do you get information regarding the situation?
- 4. Do you notify your employees?
