- Eastern Pacific Hurricane Blas, Disturbance 1 Low (near 10%)
- Central Pacific No tropical cyclones expected through Wednesday evening
- Western Pacific Typhoon Nepartak (02W)

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms Northern/Central Plains, Middle/Upper Mississippi valleys, Upper Great Lakes
- Flash flooding Upper Mississippi Valley
- Rain/thunderstorms Northern Intermountain/Rockies; Great Basin & Rockies eastward
- Red Flag Warnings NV & UT
- Elevated Fire Weather NV, UT, ID & CA
- Excessive Heat OK; Heat Advisory NM, TX, OK, KS, NE, IA, MO, LA, AL, GA, SC, NC
- Space Weather No space weather storms observed past 24 hours, none predicted for the next 24 hours






Tropical Outlook: Eastern Pacific







Tropical Outlook: Eastern Pacific







- Located 805 miles SSW of the southern tip of Baja California
- Moving WNW at 14 mph; motion expected to continue for the next couple days
- Maximum sustained winds of 100 mph (CAT 2)
- Hurricane force winds extend outwards up to 30 miles from the center; tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 150 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings for the U.S.




<u>Disturbance 1</u>: (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located several hundred miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Conditions are expected to be conducive for gradual development
- Likely to become a tropical depression by the end of the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours Low (near 10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days High (80%)


Tropical Outlook: Central Pacific





Typhoon Nepartak (02W)







Advisory #10: (as of 5:00 a.m. EDT) - FINAL

- Located 735 miles WNW of Guam
- Moving WNW at 21 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 100 mph (CAT 2)
- Typhoon force winds extend outward 35 miles from the center
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward up to 160 miles from the center
- No projected threat for the U.S.






Severe Weather Outlook: Day 1 - 3






Precipitation Forecast: 1 - 3 Day






States with Currently Occupied Units
